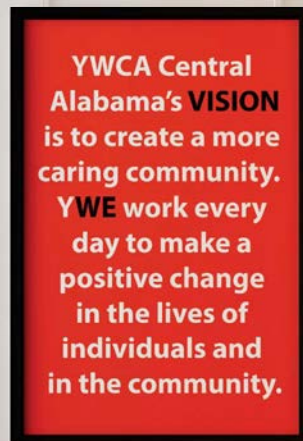

YWCA Central Alabama's Child Development Center is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), an honor only 6 percent of centers in the country have earned. The First Class Pre-K program** prepares students for "big school," so they are ready to learn and are on track academically, socially, and emotionally with their peers.*

CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Our Child Development Center is nationally accredited and serves children from working-class, low-income, and homeless families from ages 8 weeks to 5 years. Our programs in child development serve families in local shelters, exiting domestic violence and facing poverty, as well as working-class families from around Birmingham. All children receive daily hot breakfast, lunch, and snacks and are educated, nurtured, and loved.

AFTER-SCHOOL ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

The After-School Enrichment Program (ASEP) provides academic support for homeless children in grades K-8. The summer program offers field trips, academic instruction, swimming, arts, and more.

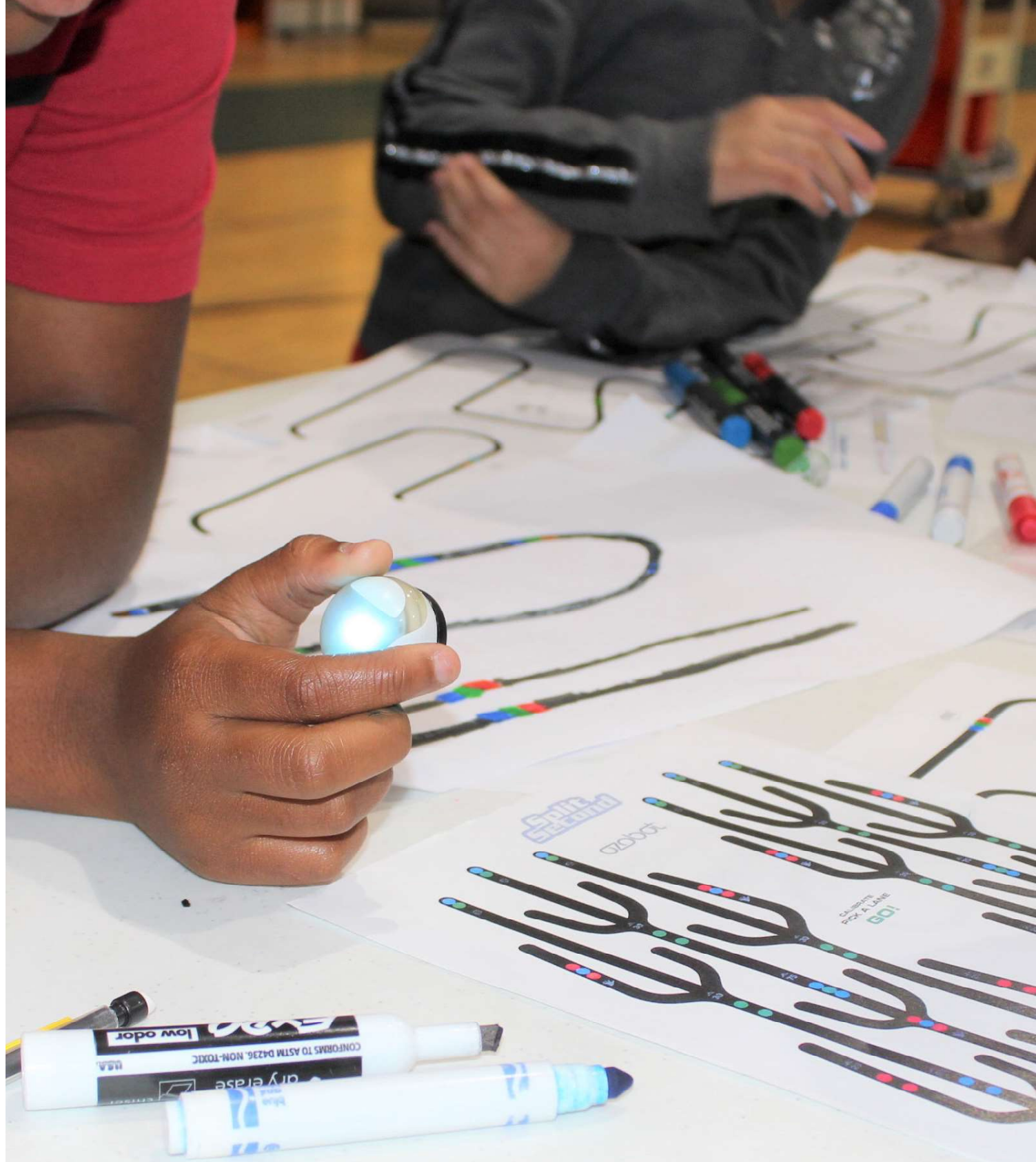

MISSION IMPACT

Unfortunately, for some of the YW's youngest clients, the basic comforts of life aren't always at hand.

The YW's After-School Enrichment Program (ASEP) provides children residing in shelter a respite from the difficulties they face and a place to build a strong, steady foundation.

Emma is a bright young lady who was experiencing the challenges that come with a temporary living situation. She had been bullied at school, which led to a lack of self-confidence and affected her academic performance.

Her predicament would soon change.

As a seventh-grader, she came to YWCA ASEP at

the beginning of the 2018-19 school year. She worked alongside ASEP staff members and learned how to appropriately work through emotions brought on by life's daily stressors.

Emma is now part of the YW's Will 2 Win mentoring program offered by The Flora Pearl Foundation. Volunteers in this enrichment program teach students effective leadership through professional and personal training and development. Emma blossomed in this program and has grown and transformed into a young woman who now has the confidence to dream big despite life's challenges.

Emma credited her development to ASEP and often referred to the program as her "home away from home." Because of the support she received while attending ASEP, she moves closer to pursuing her personal goals with a strong sense of achievement.

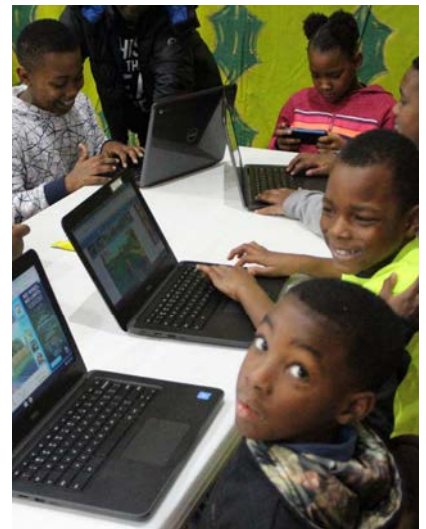

EMERGENCY SERVICES

The YW has **emergency shelters** for victims and their children that serve Jefferson, St. Clair, and Blount counties. The agency operates a **24-Hour Crisis Line (205.322.4878)** to assist callers with safety planning and other resources.

SUPERVISED VISITATION

The Supervised Visitation and Exchange Center at YWCA Central Alabama provides an emotionally and physically safe environment for children to visit with their noncustodial parents.

SILENT WITNESSES

Coca-Cola Bottling Co. UNITED volunteers add a fresh coat of paint to the YW's "silent witnesses." Each year, the cutouts are affixed with stories about local homicides involving domestic violence victims and then displayed as reminders of the magnitude of intimate partner violence.

Silent Witness

How The Initiative Began

In 1990, an ad hoc group of women artists and writers, upset about the growing number of women in Minnesota being murdered by their partners or acquaintances, joined together with several other women's organizations to form Arts Action Against Domestic Violence. They felt an urgency to do something that would speak out against the escalating domestic violence in their state, something that would commemorate the lives of the 26 women whose lives had been lost in 1990 as a result of domestic violence. After much brainstorming, they decided to create 26 free-standing, life-sized red wooden figures, each one bearing the name of a woman who once lived, worked, had neighbors, friends, family, children, whose life ended violently at the hands of a husband, ex-husband, partner, or acquaintance. A twenty-seventh figure was added to represent those uncounted women whose murders went unsolved or were erroneously ruled accidental. The organizers called the figures the Silent Witnesses.

YWCA Central Alabama supports the Silent Witness Initiative in order to promote healthy, non-violent relationships. These life-sized wooden figures

MISSION IMPACT

The YW's Court Advocacy Program links a survivor with a professional advocate who provides guidance through the intimidating legal system.

In the spring of 2019, the emergency fund provided by the Independent Presbyterian Church (IPC) Foundation helped Meagan during her time of crisis.

Meagan worked with YWCA's Blount County office to file a Protection from Abuse Order (PFA) against her violent husband of six years. She developed chronic health issues as a result of the violence and was unable to work for several months. Eight weeks after her husband had been out of the home, Meagan was running out of money and was delinquent in her bills.

Meagan was running out of money and was delinquent in her bills. She appealed to YWCA for help.

She appealed to YWCA for help when her water and electricity were disconnected. The YW used its emergency support fund to help Meagan remain in her home and avoid becoming homeless. The process was so expedient that Meagan's son didn't even realize there had been a crisis with the utilities.

These funds gave Meagan a sense of relief and helped her maintain her hope. Meagan has been able to heal and search for work again.

CLIENT SERVICES

The YW offers a variety of client services, including counseling, advocacy, and emergency assistance.



COMMUNITY SUPPORT

YWCA Central Alabama's Housing Department is committed to providing excellent housing and supportive programming for women, children and families and works every day to ensure equal and fair access to a variety of housing types to accommodate multiple needs.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

YWCA provides affordable housing units for individuals and families living paycheck to paycheck, including the elderly, disabled, homeless, and other vulnerable populations.

TRANSITIONAL & PERMANENT HOUSING

The YW offers more than 137 affordable housing units, including permanent housing as well as transitional housing for women escaping abusive relationships.

CREATING RESPONSIBLE, EDUCATED, WORKING TEENS


The CREW program provides valuable summer work experience for teenagers and is administered in the YW's Family Resource Center, which serves the Woodlawn community.

YWoodlawn is an empowerment initiative to reduce poverty through affordable housing and community-based health, education, and employment-related services.

MISSION IMPACT

Erica knows first-hand that YWCA Central Alabama is on a mission for every working mother who needs affordable childcare.

A former YWCA employee and YWoodlawn resident, Erica found herself needing assistance in 2019. Prior to moving into YW Housing, she and her daughter were living in unhealthy and unsafe conditions. She left her job because the home instability became too overwhelming, and she was unable to fulfill the work expectations assigned by her employer.

When she was able to return to work, she had difficulty finding employment. Her bills were mounting, and she needed to provide enough food for her family. It was time to do something.

Erica connected with a case manager at YWoodlawn Family Resource Center (FRC) and received information about the FRC's workforce development program. She soon enrolled in the Ready to Work job training program and started participating in FRC's case management and supportive services.

After completing the Ready to Work program, Erica secured full-time employment with benefits, opened a savings account, and paid off debts.

Erica received financial resources and food assistance. She learned about budgeting and gained skills to increase her career readiness. Erica's baby girl was safe and sound in the YW's child development program, receiving the support, love, and stable foundation she needed to flourish — giving Erica the peace of mind she needed to commit to her studies.

Erica emerged from the YW's FRC programs ready for her next stage in life. After completing the Ready to Work program, she secured full-time employment with benefits, opened a savings account, paid off debts, and purchased a vehicle.

It provides a career pathway for individuals with limited education and employment experience.

These women browse **My Sister's Closet** with confidence and dignity and select attire and other items at no cost through our referral program.

EMPOWERING GIRLS

To empower homeless and other young girls during prom season, YWCA hosts prom dress giveaways.

Prom Palooza provides full prom attire to girls in need. Dresses, gowns, handbags, jewelry, shoes, personal shopper services, and more are all donated. It costs the girls nothing, and the joy on their faces as they try on that perfect prom dress is unmistakable!

Prom Palooza takes away the worry and stress about paying for a prom dress when you cannot afford it. Every year girls share how beautiful they felt and how appreciative they are. We make girls' dreams come true.

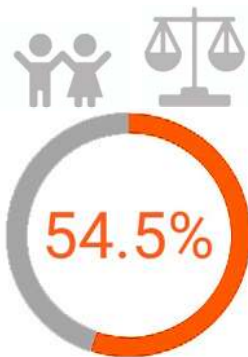
